- 3. Display Your Sign: Place your sign in your yard or another visible location around town (with permission) starting March 8th.
- 4.Share the Love: Snap a photo of your sign and post it on social media. Don't forget to tag the <u>Nelson Legacy Project</u> or use #SignsOfKindnessNelsonLegacy so we can celebrate your creation and inspire others.
